History	Neil Armstrong loved flying. He flew fighter planes for the American Navy and later tested rocket powered planes. All before becoming an astronaut!		
	On the 21 July 1969, he became the first man to walk on the Moon. He later became a professor and taught others all about flying.		
	Neil and his crew flew to the Moon in a spacecraft called Apollo 11. Only 12 people have ever walked on the surface of the Moon. Neil's footprints will be on the Moon for millions of years, because there is no wind to blow them away!		
	Mae Jemison is an American engineer, physician, and former NASA astronaut. She became the first black woman to travel into space aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavour in 1992.		
	Tim Peake is the first British astronaut to travel to space. He spent 6 months on the international space station and completed a spacewalk.		
Art	The Starry Night is an oil on canvas by the Dutch painter Vincent van Gogh. Van Gogh was Dutch, which means he was from The Netherlands. Van Gogh painted The Starry Night in June 1889.		
	He used his paint to create a swirling effect. He used light yellow paint to make it look as though the moon and stars are glowing.		
	You can make different shades of secondary colours by mixing different amounts of primary colours together or by adding black.		
Design & Technology	There are lots of different types of windmills all over Britain. They have to be stable so that they turn without the wind blowing them over.		
	When designing a structure, you need to think about what the client will need to be happy and check they have everything inside that they need.

Stand-Alone Sticky Knowledge				
RE	Shabbat (Sabbath) is the day of rest in the Jewish religion. Jews believe that God created the world in 6 days and rested on the 7th. As the Jewish weeks start on a Sunday, Saturday is the 7th day, the day of rest – Shabbat. At Shabbat, Jews think about God and what God has done for them.			
	They believe it is important for them to not work so food is prepared the day before and a special meal is eaten. The whole family is expected to observe the Sabbath, so children will			
	stay with their family at this time.			
	The meal includes many symbols, these include candles - at least 2 candles are lit, one stands for observance and the other remembrance. Food, like the challah bread, and Wine which is used for a blessing.			
	Jewish families go to the Synagogue at Shabbat to pray and give thanks to God.			
Computing	Lots of art is now created digitally, often using a pen-like stylus, such as an Apple Pencil on an iPad, although fingers on screen work almost as well.			
	It is very easy to modify digital art, e.g. by undoing mistakes or applying effects such as brightening or darkening areas of the image			
	The difference between painting on a canvas and painting digitally is that when you paint digitally you can use an undo button. On a canvas you cannot!			
	When you make a stack of images in digital art, this is layering. This is similar to when you paint on a canvas and use layers of colour.			
Music	A performance is sharing music with other people, called an audience. We can add our own ideas to a performance and make recordings to listen back to later.
