	Humanists believe we should use empathy and consider the impact of our actions on other people and animals.			
	Humanists believe we should be free to make the most of the one life we have, seeking happiness and supporting others to do the same.			
	The Humanist symbol is called the Happy Human. The symbol was chosen as the design was simple. The symbol shows a human, but it could have been either a male or female. Within a few years, this symbol became the international symbol of Humanism.			
	Humanists believe in a golden rule in life. This is to treat others how you would like to be treated.			
Music	Classical music differs from Pop music because it is not made just to be popular for a short time or just to be a commercial success. It is different from Folk music, which belongs to the people who want to perform it and passed to future generations by listening and copying.			
	Many people are unaware that Classical music is still being composed today, although it is very different from what was created several hundred years ago.
